Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$7 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver more than 200 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

Project overview

A project is underway to relocate the Mainsbridge School. The new school will deliver purpose-built facilities that cater to the needs of the current students across primary and high school.

The new facility will provide flexible learning spaces including quiet zones designed with consideration for children with specific needs, an administration and staff building, a multipurpose hall and performance stage, external play spaces, sports field, a two-storey library with multimedia areas and an indoor hydrotherapy pool.

Progress summary

- Completed the façade works to most blocks.
- Installed structural steel to the hydrotherapy pool
- Started works to the entry driveway and landscaping.

Work taking place in the school holidays

- Continue with the internal fit out to Blocks A, B, C, D and E.
- Continue remediation and civil works to the South of the site and Warwick Farm Oval.
- Completing external landscaping including planting.
- Installation of soft fall and play equipment.
- Work beginning on the Mainsbridge School Carpark.
- Remove scaffolding to the buildings when building facades are complete.

The liberty swing currently on site at the current Mainsbridge School location will also be relocated over the school holidays.

The Mainsbridge School relocation is projected to be finished in early 2021, with students and staff relocating to the new site from Day 1, Term 2, 2021.

Frequently Asked Questions

How will traffic be managed?

Construction traffic will continue to access the site via the Williamson Crescent entry.

Traffic control will continue to be in place as required to manage pedestrian and vehicular movements near the site access points.

What safety measures will be in place?

Health and safety are our highest priority. We will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that construction works will be scheduled and managed to minimise impacts to the community where possible.

Perimeter hoardings have been installed to prevent non construction workers accessing the site.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Noise and dust control measures will be implemented in accordance with planning approval requirements.

Hoarding and shade cloth is currently installed on the site boundaries to reduce dust and noise impacts on our neighbours. Dust from construction works will be hosed down with water as required. Trucks entering and leaving the site will cover their loads.

What are the construction working hours?

The standard working hours for this project remain 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays. No work will take place on Sundays or public holidays.
